



Newsletter 186 Sydney City Council Responds to Censoring University Research in Public Events

29 December 2017

On the 22 December 2017 I received a response from the City of Sydney Council providing their reason for not allowing a public presentation of my university research on vaccination to be publicised on the City of Sydney Events page (20 November 2017).

Here is my talk on [The Ingredients of Vaccines and their Effects on Children's Health](#) (based on the academic literature) that is being censored from council venues in Sydney and Melbourne.

In contrast, the Australian media is publicising information on vaccination that is being presented by unqualified people and that is not supported by the academic literature.

This false and misleading information has been used to implement mandatory and coercive vaccination policies for some Australian families due to their employment and social welfare situations. This is not extended to all Australians because vaccines did not control infectious diseases and have never been compulsory in Australia.

Here is the response that I have provided to the City of Sydney Council regarding their reason for censoring events presenting university research from the "What's on in Sydney" events page. Please note it was copied to ~60 University of Wollongong academics (UOW) and the UOW Vice-Chancellor:

Dear Ms Barone,

I have just received your response to the censoring of university research by the City of Sydney Council.

Firstly thank you for explaining that your "What's on Protocol" doesn't allow events to be publicised that are "perceived to affect public health".

Unfortunately this does not make any sense. Public health can only be protected by debating university research. A society that makes assumptions about academic research and suppresses it before it can be scrutinised is not protecting public health. Does your protocol state that events presenting university research on health cannot be publicised on your events page?

What is the purpose of university research if it is not for public debate of the issues?

Here is an article that will allow you to see what is at risk if you censor freedom of speech on university research. Your actions in suppressing this debate will be complicit in a crime against humanity as discussed in this article [Federal Law acknowledges Lag Time of up to Two Months between Vaccination and onset of Autoimmune Disease.](#)

Please ask UOW Professor's Heather Yeatman and Alison Jones to provide you with their peer-reviewed articles that refute the evidence above and in my PhD thesis. They do not have any peer-reviewed articles on vaccination and yet they are being permitted to use the UOW logo to make unsupported claims about vaccines. You should be very concerned that these UOW academics will not publicly debate this topic and yet they are both involved in suppressing university research on this topic in articles and personal opinion pieces.

Unless you can provide me with the peer-reviewed articles on vaccination written by Rachael Dunlop, Heather Yeatman and Alison Jones (Dean of the UOW Faculty of Science, Medicine and Health) then you will be complicit in suppressing the risks of a medical procedure that has serious consequences for human health.

If you cannot provide this evidence to support your "careful consideration of this event" then I trust that you will allow me to promote my university research on the City of Sydney events page when I return to Sydney next year. Just like any other academic who wishes to speak on their topic in a public forum in Sydney.

I have copied this email to the concerned community as well as the UOW academics that will not publicly debate this topic because they have never done in-depth research in this field.
